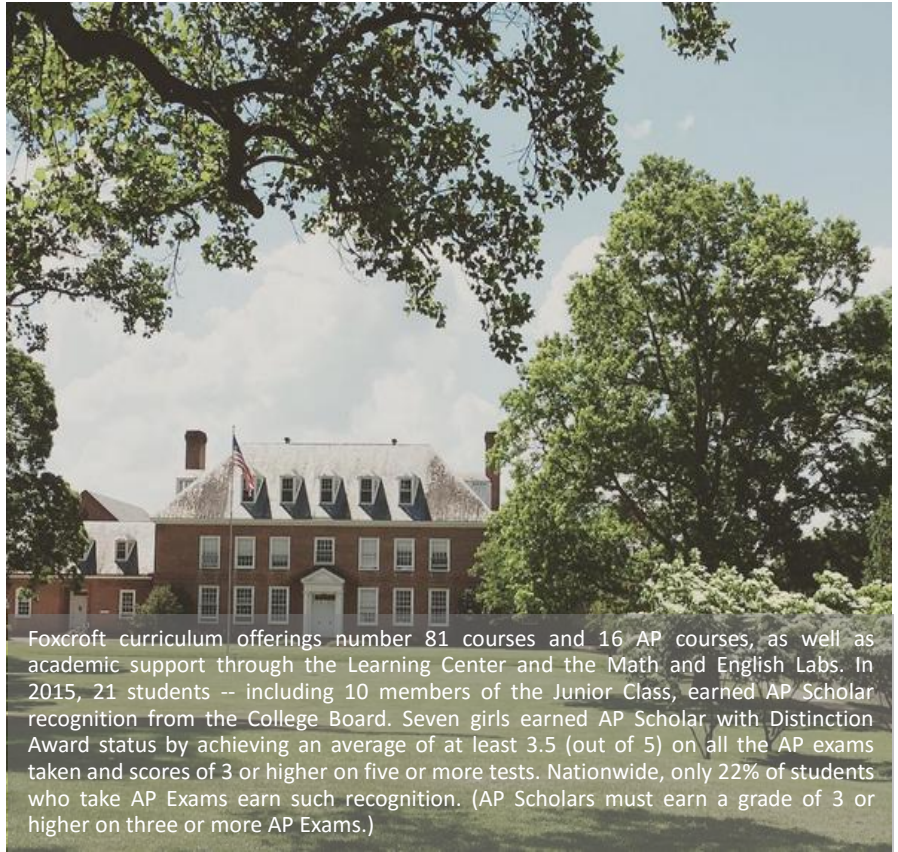
Campus:

located on 500 acres in Middleburg, Virginia, 50 miles west of Washington, D.C. and the closest airport is Dulles (45 minutes by car). In addition to the cultural attractions of the capital and the outdoor adventures of the Blue Ridge Mountains and Shenandoah Valley, the area is full of history.

Facilities:

Foxcroft curriculum offerings number 81 courses and 16 AP courses, as well as academic support through the Learning Center and the Math and English Labs. In 2015, 21 students -- including 10 members of the Junior Class, earned AP Scholar recognition from the College Board. Seven girls earned AP Scholar with Distinction Award status by achieving an average of at least 3.5 (out of 5) on all the AP exams taken and scores of 3 or higher on five or more tests. Nationwide, only 22% of students who take AP Exams earn such recognition. (AP Scholars must earn a grade of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.)



Excellent STEM program

Foxcroft is at the forefront of STEM education and inspiring girls to pursue these vital fields of study: More than 35% of its 2014 graduates chose STEM fields as their majors in college -- compared to 20% nationally. Science and Math faculty incorporate new teaching strategies, technologies, projects and service learning into students' lives, and School facilities include STEM lab, an engineering workshop, an Animal Room and interactive whiteboards in every classroom. In addition, the Read Observatory houses a Newtonian-Cassegrain reflecting telescope, two 8-inch Celestron telescopes, and astrophotography and solar-observing accessories.



College fair

Foxcroft offers a robust college preparatory academic program which prepares young women for a future that demands intelligent responses, highly developed skills, and firmly rooted character.



Students take part in a variety of activities and clubs. Typically, students choose and become members of clubs during the first few weeks of school in the fall. Most of the clubs are run by students with the assistance of a faculty advisor.

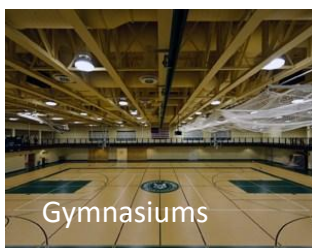


Student Dorm

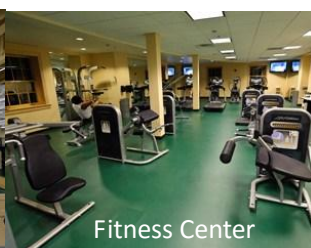
% Students Boarding: 70%; This year we have 25% international students from 15 different countries, including Mexico, China, South Korea, Switzerland, Vietnam, Spain, Australia, Japan, etc. About 85 percent of the faculty live on campus and all are available outside of class for extra help, review, and additional work.

Dorms: A typical room houses 2-3 campers and has its private bathroom with a shower and toilet. Full-time housemothers, additional faculty who live in or near the dorm, and student leaders comprise the "Dorm Team," and are responsible for making sure that each and every student is known and valued. Our housemothers' main responsibility is the well-being of the girls in their dormitory homes. Housemothers are in constant contact with teachers, the Office of Student Life, advisors, and the Health Center
